

- Once the Abstract is accepted, the full text of the original, unpublished paper should be submitted (no more than 2500-3000 words typed in MS Word using Times New Roman, font size 12 on A-4 size paper in 1.5 spacing, Reference APA 6th edition).
- The first author and the presenter should be a student. Papers with less than 15 per cent plagiarism will be accepted for conference presentation and further processing for publication.
- All the selected papers will adhere to the double-blind review process.
- Selected papers will be published in UGC Care Listed Journals. The authors should bear the
 publication charges. Paper acceptance for publication in a UGC Care Listed Journal will be
 based on the scrutiny of publishers.





How satisfied are you with?




